



Palm Sunday of the Lord's Passion

"Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord."

Mark 11: 1-10

Procession with Palms

Dear Parishioners:

At both gospels today, at the procession and the passion narrative, Jesus gives his disciples instructions that are striking in their specificity, and which occur just as he says. They find a donkey where they are supposed to; the bystanders allow them to take it. They follow a man carrying water and find the Upper Room waiting for them. Jesus continues to make predictions as he moves through the passion, like the shaking of the disciples' faith and the approach of Judas. In all this, Jesus seems to be in control, accepting calmly the horrific things that await him. Even as he prays from a place of deep sorrow, even as he pleads with God to "take this cup away," he accepts with steadfast courage what he is about to suffer. Jesus knows that the death that awaits him is not the end of his story. His faith in the God who gives life enables him to face his unthinkable torment.

In today's second reading, Saint Paul puts forth the image of Jesus emptying himself. The Son of God took on the form of a slave, emptying himself of all divine privileges so that he might fully enter the sufferings of humanity. Jesus' act of emptying created space for him to be filled again with the glory of God. Emptying can be difficult work and it can also be life-giving in the end. Consider how you might empty yourself this Holy Week so that you might have more space to receive the joys of resurrection at Easter.

Over the coming days, the church invites us to accompany Jesus on his journey to Jerusalem. The liturgies of Holy Week offer chances to feel with Jesus and his disciples the palm branches waving in the streets, the water that washes over the feet, the bread and wine shared in memory of Christ, the wood of the cross.

What suffering have you gone through or are you going through? How can you unite that suffering to Christ's?

I hope you can join us throughout this week and participate in the various liturgies as we accompany Jesus through his passion, death and resurrection.






