Third Sunday of Easter

April 14, 2024

"Thus, it was written that the Christ would suffer and rise from the dead on the third day." Luke 24: 35-48

Dear Parishioners:

Today's gospel passage follows the story of Cleopas and his companion encountering Christ on the road to Emmaus. The two disciples invite the man to dine with them, not realizing he was Jesus. At the blessing and breaking of the bread, the disciples' eyes were opened, and they recognized that the one sitting around the table was their risen Savior. Soon after Jesus startles another group of disciples who also did not recognize him at first glance. Their reactions beg the question: what keeps us from recognizing Christ in our midst? How can our senses be opened, through prayer, sacred encounters, and acts of service, so that we are ready to greet Christ when he comes again?

We, too do not always react with wholehearted joy when we encounter Jesus. He often comes to us in unexpected ways and asks us for sacrifices we don't But Jesus' response is to offer want to make. reassurance. He has the disciples look more closely, showing them the wounds he endured on the cross and eating in front of them to reassure them that he is not the ghost they fear he is. Jesus responds to our hesitation with the same reassurance. He always invites us to come closer, to see more fully who he is and what he is doing. And when we do, when we finally see him well enough, our response will echo the disciples' amazement and joy.

Jesus proves the reality of his glorified human

presence to the disciples when he poses the common, bodily question: Have you anything here to eat? The image of the risen Christ chowing down on baked fish is both amusing and profound. Our God rose to new life and brought the fullness of the human experience with him. There is no part of our realities that Christ did not redeem.

A core part of Jesus' ministry was opening minds and hearts to the Scriptures. The Hebrew Scriptures,

specifically the law of Moses, the writings of the prophets, and the psalms shaped Jesus during his life. The Christian Scriptures that would come later continue the wisdom put forth in these ancient texts. The Son of God continues to open minds and hearts to the revelations in Scripture. See what Jesus may reveal to us through the sacred stories.


