Twenty-Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time October 1, 2023

"He changed his mind and went. Tax collectors and prostitutes are entering the kingdom of heaven before you." Matthew 21:28-32

Dear Parishioners:

This week's gospel gives us another parable and another vineyard. We're still talking about the exceeding generosity of God and how it surpasses all our hopes and imaginings. Here, it is about second chances, and it is good news for all of us. Life brings countless opportunities to fail to do right, and all of us fail sometimes. But it is never too late to change course, and we are never too far gone to come back. God's love reaches far beyond what we expect; in fact, our limited imaginations often cause us to exclude daughters and sons with whom God is well pleased. God's love is not limited to those who appear to be living moral and religious lives; it most fully embraces those on the margins of what we and our too-small imaginations have deemed acceptable.

Changing one's mind is a point of growth for the first son in this gospel. After an initial decline, he does as his father says and goes to work in the vineyard. The first son ultimately makes a good decision, even if he started off on a rocky foot. The second son in today's gospel, meanwhile, appears to be in alignment with his father's wishes. He gives a suitable answer, presumably because he knew what should be done. But in the end, his actions do not live up to his words. Talk is cheap when it is not followed up by actions. Todays' gospel invites us to consider who is worthy to enter the kingdom of God-and to beware that the answer might not be apparent at first glance.

Jesus celebrates when we change our minds. The one who God greatly exalted, who emptied himself and took the form of a slave out of love for us, longs for us to draw closer to him. Are there areas of our lives that could use a change or a different answer? What will it take for such a conversion to happen? Let us ask the Lord for help and healing?

Speaking about change, there have been a lot of changes over the summer, especially with our parish buildings. Allow me to share with you what has been done and what is expected to happen.

Our Old School Building is being pointed, lintels replaced, power washed, and sealed.

Our New School Building is now fully Air Conditioned. Each classroom has a A/C unit, which St. Ephrem Catholic Academy has paid for through their fundraising efforts. The Msgr. Kain Hall now has central Air Conditioning which the parish paid for.

Shortly, the construction for the Church Handicap Ramp will begin. This was the last thing that was promised as part of our 100th Anniversary Campaign.

We are in the process of converting our church boiler from oil to gas and installing a new boiler.

The Church roof needs to be repaired by the 74th Street parking lot door. Once the roof has been repaired, then that area of the church ceiling will be scraped and painted.

The Church floor was stripped of over 50 years of wax and build up. Repairs where made where needed and the floor was buffed and polished.

These projects have been funded by parish funds and a Diocesan loan. I always like to keep you updated on what is going on. These improvements are needed, whether it provides a welcome, a comfortable atmosphere, or being more environmentally friendly. Thank you for your support!
