Thirty-First Sunday in Ordinary Time November 5, 2023 "They preach but they do not practice." Matthew 23:1-12

Dear Parishioners:

Today's gospel has one of Jesus' familiar reversals of our expectations for this world. He states the visible religious leaders of his time are not, in fact, in favor with God. Their misguided love for recognition and honor outweighs their love for God. They seem to hold power, and by earthly standards, they do-but they are not enacting the true power that is available to all of us. This power is God's gift and enables us to enact God's will. It doesn't look much like power, though; it rather looks a lot like servanthood. Jesus tells his followers to humble themselves, because humility is the basis of true exaltation in God's ordering of things. "Whoever exalts himself will be humbled; but whoever humbles himself will be exalted." This humility is found in unity, joined as brothers and sisters under one loving teacher and father and master.

Before we point fingers too quickly-and likely fall into the same hypocrite camp Jesus tells us to avoid, let us consider how Jesus approaches the scribes and Pharisees. Note, that Jesus first recognizes the truth in their teachings: "Do and observe all things whatsoever they tell you." Then Jesus speaks

honestly and directly to the issues he sees, naming specific examples of ways their actions fall short of the law's intent. Jesus once again models how we should approach others who we believe are in the wrong.

Surely, we can all think of someone who acts a little too righteous while trying to show off their faith and presents a hypocritical message in the process.

Rather than bad-mouthing them or writing them off completely, what if we were to follow Jesus' way of respectful, honest, and direct dialogue?



Jesus came to heal the whole person, body & soul



ministry of the priest, it is Jesus
who touches the sick to heal them
from sin – and sometimes even
from physical ailment. His cures were signs of the
coming of the Kingdom of God. The core message of his
healing tells us of his plan to conquer sin and death by his
dying and rising.

The Rite of Anointing tells us there is no need to wait until a person is at the point of death to receive the Sacrament. A careful judgment about the serious nature of the illness is sufficient.

When the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick is given, the hoped-for effect is that, if it be God's will, the person be physically healed of illness. But even if there is no physical healing, the primary effect of the Sacrament is a spiritual healing by which the sick person receives the Holy Spirit's gift of peace and courage to deal with the difficulties that accompany serious illness or the frailty of old age.
