Thirty-Second Sunday in Ordinary Time November 12, 2023

"Behold, the bridegroom! Come out to meet him! Matthew 25:1-3

Dear Parishioners:

The end of the liturgical year always presents us with Scripture passages that speak of the end of times. This thee will continue into Advent's theme to stay awake and ready for the ultimate coming of Christ. "Stay awake, for you know neither the day nor the hour." The Bible's image of this time is sometimes troubling; here, we have a locked door and a Bridegroom who refuses to recognize those who came unprepared for the wedding feast, hardly a reassuring image of Christ's boundless mercy. But this is not a gospel about the mechanics of our preparation; when put into dialogue with the other readings for today, it becomes a gospel about our longing to be with Jesus. Those whose hearts desire him will find ways to prepare their hearts. The specifics of that preparation will look different for all of us but love and longing are at their core.

How can we prepare to wait? This odd question strikes at the heart of today's gospel. Jesus offers the parable of ten virgins waiting for the bridegroom to help his followers imagine what it will be like to wait for the Son of Man to return. First, we see the virgins arrive together and stay together. If only one virgin had been there alone all night, it would have been much easier for her to give up. Who would kept her motivated? Who would she have turned to when the waiting got hard? Like the virgins, Jesus wants us to live in joyful hope for the coming of the kingdom as a community. The Church at its best encourages and strengthens the community of believers.

The wise virgins came prepared with flasks of oil, but not infinite amounts. Similarly, Jesus calls us to be ready to wait for the coming of God's kingdom with for the coming humility and patience, recognizing that we do not yet have the fullness of faith, hope, and love in our lamps. But we do have something. Our lamps need not run empty if we use our oil well. Like the wise virgins, we are called to wait with anticipation. Surely the bridegroom will come back! If the wise virgins had no faith in the bridegroom's return, why would they have continued to wait? Something, likely those spiritual gifts of faith, hope and love, convinced them to keep vigil. We too receive spiritual gifts through the sacraments and the life of the church that empower us to keep waiting and to keep believing that what has been promised by God will one day be fulfilled.

In today's bulletin on page 3 there is a special letter from Bishop Brennan, regarding important issues that he will be addressing in the near future. I shared with you the discussion that Bishop Brennan has had with Priests', Deans, and many others. At this point Bishop Brennan is beginning the conversation with the faithful of the Diocese. Please take the opportunity to read this very important letter from Bishop Brennan and remain informed. Let us continue to pray for one another!



To the Clergy, Staffs and the Faithful parishioners of Brooklyn and Queens,

Recently, I met with our Vicar General, Regional Vicars, local Deans and priests during our annual Priest Convocation in Douglaston. During this gathering, we discussed important issues that we will need to address in the near future, like new models of parish life, possible collaborations among parishes regarding Religious Education and other ministries, as well as assessing the current Mass schedules at all our parishes.

Allow me to share with you some statistics that were shared with the priests:

- In 2017, Mass attendance in our Diocese was reported at an average of 205,502 people per weekend. In 2022, the average was reported at 124,031. Due to demographic changes as well as the overall national trend of fewer Catholics attending Sunday Mass regularly, we see a decrease of nearly 40 percent in Mass attendance in our diocese in the last 5 years. This decline in Mass attendance means that we have in many parishes throughout the diocese large capacity churches with a significantly reduced Mass size.
- Due to a high number of priest retirements and deaths in recent years, there are fewer priests serving in our 175 parishes.
- In our diocese Mass is celebrated in 14 different languages on a weekly basis and in 26 languages monthly. This unique pastoral challenge in combination with the reduced number of clergy with bi-lingual skills further complicates the ability to best serve our parishes with specific language needs.

There is no simple solution to these issues. In many of our parishes it is evident that we do not need so many separate Masses to accommodate the number of parishioners in attendance at Sunday Eucharist each week. We are asking pastors and administrators throughout the diocese in Brooklyn and Queens, in consultation with their pastoral councils, to review and evaluate their Mass schedules. In many parishes, the number of Masses celebrated each weekend could be reduced by at least one or maybe more Masses, depending on the number of people attending and the capacity of each church.

Additionally, your pastor in coordination with your Regional Vicar and local Dean, are beginning discussions at the deanery level concerning possible collaborations among neighboring parishes regarding Religious Education programs and other ministries, that could possibly lead to formal parish partnerships.

I ask for your openness and cooperation with these possible changes. Not every parish will be affected, but most will go through some sort of adjustment, in order to be able to most effectively serve the current needs of the People of God in our great Diocese.

Be assured of my prayers for each of you, and may I humbly ask for your prayers, especially for our pastors and administrators, and all those who will be part of these discussions taking place throughout our parishes and deaneries.
