Third Sunday of Advent



December 17, 2023

"There is one among you whom you do not recognize."
John 1:6-8, 19-28

Dear Parishioners:

John the Baptist gets so much of our Advent attentionbut why do we have him at all? He is not the main event; he is very clear about this from the beginning. What he offers is incomplete revelation, a promise yet to be fulfilled, a lesser baptism than the one who is to come. Why does God work in this way? Why not send us Christ directly and immediately and get right down to the work of salvation? We may not ever know why, but we can take a cue from John the Baptist in accepting the partial nature of what we see of God's work. John knows his place and accepts it in humility. He embodies the prayer by Bishop Ken Untener that reminds us: "We are...ministers, not messiahs. We are prophets of a future not our own.' Like John, we each play some small but irreplaceable role in revealing and announcing Christ. The partial nature of this work can be frustrating, but God's ways are not our ways, and God's timing cannot be rushed.

Imagine a jubilee happening today. How might God's blessings transform lives? What might God do to relieve the sorrow and suffering of creation? We need not wait passively for a jubilee to happen. The prophet Isaiah paves a way for dreaming of a year of favor from the Lord. We too can imagine the freedom of jubilee time-and work to make it happen. In ways big and small, we can be people of jubilee. We can tend to the needs of people who are vulnerable and hurting. Through our words and actions, we can bring about rejoicing in the name of God.

John comes to testify to the light. We too are called to reflect the light of Christ to the world. Where will you shine in these days leading up to Christmas?

Thank you to all for helping us make our Annual Catholic Appeal 2023 Parish Goal. The two collections and several generous parishioners made this happen. This is includes 13 parishioners who have to fulfill their pledge. I am grateful for your generosity throughout the year! Once the diocesan report is updated it will be reflected in our bulletin.


