# Third Sunday in Ordinary Time January 21, 2024

"Repent and believe in the Gospel."

Mark 1:14:20

Dear Parishioners:

Last week's gospel gave us John's depiction of Simon and Andrew's calling; here we have the same moment as depicted by Mark. Here the brothers are together, rather than called one by one, and since John is imprisoned, he is not involved in pointing the way. The stories seem contradictory and cannot both be factually true, but their different emphases help to reveal more of the ever-unfolding truth about Jesus and what it means to follow him. In this story, the apostles-to-be are called when they are in the midst of their daily work. Jesus interrupts them, and rather than ignoring him are pressing on with their work, they stop. Something about him compels them to accept this disruption to their everyday lives. They respond with extraordinary trust to something that could have been received as mere inconvenience, and they encounter God there.

Jesus calls Simon and Andrew from their work catching fish. He opens new possibilities for the disciples, saying, "Come after me, and I will make you fishers of men." Conversations about calling often center on what we are being called to-like a career change, budding relationship, or new way of being in the world. But being called to something almost always necessitates being called away from something else. God did not create us with unlimited time and attention. We are constantly negotiating between giving up and taking on. There are times in life when God calls us from a particular situation or relationship. today's gospel, Jesus calls Simon and Andrew from their job as fishermen so that they could be free to embrace a life discipleship. What might God be calling us away from these days? What new calling may be emerging in its place?

Today's gospel makes an intriguing statement on the priority of work. To a culture that values climbing the corporate ladder and giving your whole self to your job, Mark's Gospel says stop. There is a different way. We cannot make work into a god. Discipleship must take priority.

Next weekend begins Catholic Schools Week. We will gather at the 11:00 am Mass to mark the beginning of this special week. I hope you can join us for this celebration and gather for light refreshments in The Msgr. Kain Hall and see the exciting Catholic Education that St. Ephrem Catholic Academy has to offer.

Words of Explanation for the Financial Report of the Fiscal Year September 1, 2022 through August 31,2023

Please note that our Ordinary Income (Sunday & Holy Day, Christmas, and Easter Collections) do not cover our Ordinary Expenses. This is the primary way in which we sustain ourselves.

You will also notice under Extraordinary Income that it reflects several items such as: 100<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Capital Campaign, I.R.S. COVID Employee Retention Refund, Parish Fundraisers, and the rental from our Old School Building.

Also reflected is the Extraordinary Expenses of over \$495,600 due to Major Renovations to our Church and other upgrades to our entire plant.

Lastly, we did close the year with a loss of (\$117,956).

Your generosity has allowed us to sustain our parish. This includes our many ministries, paying our bills, the salaries of our devoted staff, parish improvements, and currently, safety measures such as the sanitization of our Church to ensure we can gather safely.

Thank you for sharing your time, talent, and treasure with our faith community.
