

Fifteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time July 14, 2024

"He began to send them out." Mark 6: 7-13

Dear Parishioners:

In this gospel Jesus begins to delegate. He sends his apostles to extend his work of preaching and healing. His instructions are hard. They are to go with no supplies and are to rely on the hospitality of others. They are to expect rejection and are to settle nowhere. Yet they do not go alone. Jesus sends them in pairs. And he goes with them too, in a way, giving them his own authority over unclean spirits and his own power to heal those who are sick. In the same way, Jesus goes with us, remaining with the church in the sacraments. God also gives us each other as companions on the long journey of Christian life, and is present to us in any relationship where love reigns.

Jesus instructs the disciples on how to exit a difficult situation with dignity. If a place does not welcome them, the disciples are to leave by simply shaking the dust off their feet on the way out. This traditional Jewish gesture is a gentle yet pointed way to depart. The hostile household receives dirt rather than the word of God. Jesus wants the disciples to be prepared for rejection. Not every person is ready to receive the good news. That does not mean we stop preaching it, but it does require disciples to be discerning about when it is time to pack up and move on.


God calls people to discipleship in the midst of everyday life. In today's first reading, a shepherd named Amos finds himself pulled from the fields and sent out to prophesy in the name of God. Amos claimed he was no prophet, but God had other plans in mind. We may not be sent to northern Israel, but like Amos, God calls each of us for the work of discipleship exactly where we are. In our homes, workplaces, schools, and communities, we are called to spread God's message of love to the world.

Are You Being Called to be a Deacon?



A deacon is a man who is called by God and after discernment, formation, and preparation is ordained by his bishop to serve the needs of God's people. If a married man is called to the diaconate, his wife must consent and support his decision to seek formation and ordination. As Catholics, we believe that each ordained deacon is conformed through

the sacramental grace of Holy Orders into the image of Jesus the Servant.

Threefold Service of a Deacon

- *Service to the Word of God:* the deacon is called to be a man of deep prayer, becoming familiar with and a living witness to the Word of God in his ministry, among his family, and in the workplace.
- Service to the Eucharist: Every deacon is called to serve the sacrament of Christ's Body and Blood by his proper participation in the Liturgy, his love and reverence of the Blessed Sacrament, and his willingness to bring the Eucharist to those who are sick and unable to join the community of faith in Sunday worship.
- *Service on behalf of Justice, Charity, and Peace:* Deacons serve as Christ's heralds of hope and love to the poor, disabled, needy, lonely, young, forgotten, and society's outcasts.

This fall there are two evenings of inquiry scheduled for men who are interested in the Diaconate in the Diocese of Brooklyn.




